Reflections on Readings for Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### "Martha, Martha . . . There Is Need Of Only One Thing"

This Sunday's readings are all about hospitality and focus on the Lord. First, we hear of Abraham greeting three mysterious visitors and then in the Gospel, Martha and Mary attend to their visitor Jesus, albeit in different ways.



Their story highlights two important aspects of hospitality-giving service and being attentive.

In our first reading (Genesis 18:1-10), Abraham encountered three men standing near the entrance to his tent. He went overboard in hosting his strange visitors, but also took the time to listen and be attentive to them. He brought them water to bath their feet and had a fine meal prepared for them. What he didn't realize at the time was that one of the three visitors was the Lord himself. His reward was the promise of a son despite his and his wife Sarah's old age. "One of them said, 'I will surely return to you about this time next year, and Sarah will then have a son."

In our Epistle reading (Colossians 1:24-28), St. Paul wrote to his beloved community in Colossae as he languished in prison. He told how he "rejoices in my sufferings for your sake". How strange for someone to rejoice in his sufferings. Paul was blessed to unite his suffering with Christ on the cross and calls us to do the same. Unlikely as it may seem, we are often closest to Jesus when we embrace our sufferings and unite them with His on the cross. It can give meaning and purpose to our suffering.

In our Gospel reading (Luke 10:38-42), Jesus seemingly rebukes Martha for her fretting about preparing and serving the meal and complaining about Mary's attentiveness to Jesus. Both are important, but the latter more so, says Jesus. Discipleship calls us to listen and be attentive to the word of God. In it's most basic form, that is what prayer is.

Jesus told Martha in our Gospel today, "There is need of only one thing." It is clear by the context what Jesus meant - be attentive to me; listen to me; keep your focus on me; everything else comes second. Yes, there is a time for fixing and fussing, but not at the expense of our alone-time with Jesus-our prayer time.
